# **Urgent Prescription Delivery Service.**

Last May the PPG were asked if it would be possible to support the practice by delivering urgent prescriptions to patients who were unable to collect them from the surgery. The service has provided approximately one urgent delivery per week. We currently have 9 volunteers who are providing this service. We are looking to recruit more volunteers to spread the load.

#### Would you recommend this service to friends and family?

Cards are available at reception. Please fill one in when attending an appointment.

The NHS Friends and Family Test (FFT) was created to help understand whether patients are happy with the service provided, or where improvements are needed. It is a quick and anonymous way to give your views after receiving care or treatment across the NHS. Since its launch in 2013, more than 10 million pieces of patient feedback have been submitted. The FFT has been rolled out across most NHS services, including community care, hospitals, mental health services, maternity services, GP and dental practices, emergency care, patient transport and more.

Using the link it is possible to rate the service provided by our surgery. Our surgery has only 10 user ratings recorded. Click on "rate it yourself" under the "NHS Choices users rating" column and tick a few boxes. It only takes a couple of minutes.

PPG Virtual Membership. In order to operate effectively the PPG needs to have a membership representing a cross section of the practice population. It is unlikely that the Committee of twelve will achieve this. The virtual members receive (by email) committee meeting minutes and other documents explaining changes in the NHS, which will affect patient treatment. Virtual PPG members are encouraged to comment on what the committee are doing to put forward ideas for improving the services provided by the practice or to take part in subgroups where they feel they have some interest or expertise. # Baslow Village Defibrillators

These are situated outside the Spar shop, Village Hall and at the Sports Field. To gain access to the units please dial 999 and the Ambulance Service will provide you with the



code and send an ambulance. You don't need to be trained on using the defibrillators as the unit talks you through the process (as can the Ambulance Service). The defibrillator will analyse the heart rhythm and will only produce a shock if it is required.


